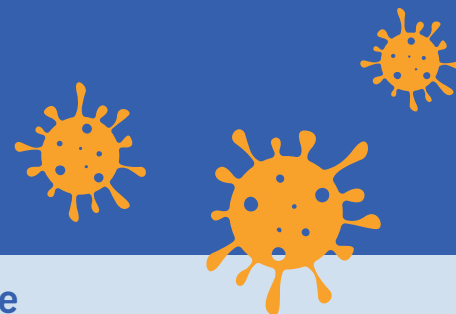


REQUIREMENTS FOR ARRIVALS BY AIR



Persons arriving in or returning to Lithuania are required to have the following:

1.



confirmation (received by e-mail) of the completed electronical questionnaire (QR code);

AND



persons at least 16 years old are required to have a document proving the negative test (PCR or antigen) for COVID-19 (prepared in one of the official languages of the European Union). The test must be taken within 72 hours before the arrival in or return to Lithuania (serological antibody test result is not accepted, the results of rapid antigen tests purchased in pharmacies, which can be performed by individuals themselves, are also not accepted);

OR



document confirming that a person has recovered from COVID-19 (coronavirus infection) and the diagnosis was confirmed by the positive SARS-Co-V2 PCR or antigen test and that maximum 180 days have passed from the positive test until the return to or arrival in the Republic of Lithuania (documents must be prepared in one of the official languages of the European Union);

OR



document (document issued by a health care facility, a country-specific vaccination certificate or an international vaccination certificate) confirming that a person has gone through the full programme of COVID-19 vaccination with vaccine registered in the European Union Register of Medicinal Products (documents must be prepared in one of the official languages of the European Union).

Upon arrival in Lithuania, documents proving that a person has recovered from COVID-19 do not need to be presented if the disease has been diagnosed in Lithuania and the data are provided in the information system esveikata.lt.

If a person has the right to the isolation exemptions set out in the Isolation Rules, he / she must indicate this while filling in the Passenger's Questionnaire (<https://keleiviams.nvsc.lt/en/form>). It is necessary to have documents proving the exception, which must be provided upon request to the National Public Health Center specialists or to the officials performing inspections of self-isolated persons.

Documents proving that a person has recovered from COVID-19 do not need to be presented if the disease has been diagnosed in Lithuania and the data are provided in the information system.

Self-isolation of 10 days from the day of return to or arrival in the Republic of Lithuania is mandatory for all (with the exemptions provided for) arriving or returning persons (irrespective of the test result). There is a possibility of shortening the self-isolation by taking a coronavirus test (PCR), at personal expense, on the 7th day of self-isolation at the earliest, with a negative result thereof.

If a person is entitled to isolation exemption, supporting documents may be requested during the inspection.

Administrative liability may be applied in accordance with Article 45(4) of the Code of Administrative Offenses of the Republic of Lithuania for provision of incorrect or incomplete information and violations of other legal acts in the field of public health or the Law on the Prevention and Control of Communicable Diseases of the Republic of Lithuania and a fine of EUR 500 to EUR 1,500 may be imposed.
